In **Class 1**, reception children have been learning about spring flowers as part of our science topic.

In **Class 2** as part of Neurodiversity Celebration Week we created a display of our uniquely decorated handprints to celebrate how we are all different. We then picked out kind words about our strengths, skills and talents and ones that celebrate different minds.





This week was Neurodiversity week. In **Class 3**, we learnt about some common conditions and how these made us even more unique. We then completed an 'about us' brain to remind us all that we are all different and made in God's image.
