

Let's Celebrate!

In Class 1, as part of International Week, we have been learning about Australia.

In **Class 2** this week, Year 2 have been learning about fractions. We started by learning about wholes and parts of the whole, for example, if the classroom is the whole then the table is part of that whole. They then moved onto creating equal parts and used shapes to show this.





This week was International week. In **Class 3**, we enjoyed learning all about Mexico!

This week in **Class 4**, we have been working on how to calculate fractions of a number and multiplying fractions by integers. We have used counters to help us solve calculations and problems.









In **Class 5** we have been celebrating International week. We chose India as our inspiration as it is a vast country of contrasts with a wide variety of landscapes and habitats. We discovered that India is the world's largest democracy, which grows more mangoes than any other country and has many English words such as shampoo, bungalow and pyjamas.

Our study in class has been the story of Rama and Sita, a story that is told during the festival of Diwali and reminds us of the importance of friendship and hope. The children enjoyed rewriting the story and making puppets to retell the story through puppetry.
