



# **Let's Celebrate!**

In **class 1** in RE, we learned about the story of Jesus' resurrection. The year 1 children then retold the story in their own words and produced some fantastic writing!








In **Class 3** this week, we have been learning about the features of recounts, particularly diary entries. We read through an example and discussed what features we could findemotional language, first person and a chronological order. We were then given the remaining features and went through the text to highlight these using a key.


In **class 4**, we have been looking at the different parts of the digestive system and their functions - lots of cutting, matching, sticking and sorting!





In **class 5** this week in science, we developed our knowledge of light. We know it travels in straight lines, reflects off objects and travels incredibly fast - it can go around the Earth seven and a half times in one second! We also learned that it takes over four years for light from the nearest star (after the sun) to reach us, and that the primary colours of light are blue, red and green.
