<u>Helping Hands</u> We held the Helping Hands AGM this week. All three trustees resigned. There were no nominations for the roles. The consequence of having no Trustees is that we are no longer able to continue as a charity, and that means we are limited to fundraising to a maximum of £5,000 per year. To put this in context, last year Helping Hands raised over £10,000, and the year before covid over £12,000. The funds raised in those years have been used to buy:

- Books
- Overhead projector
- Young Voices tshirts
- Travelling Panto
- Leavers Hoodies,

for the children at school. In previous years it has paid towards classroom upgrades, smart screens, ipads and the school extension.

All at the meeting agreed that this was a very disappointing position to be in. There was some discussion about possible ways to both continue as a charity and to relieve some of the burden from the Trustees who felt that the role brings with it an expectation of undertaking a large share of the workload.

The decision was made that the current Trustees will continue in their roles on an interim basis, in order that Helping Hands can continue to operate as a charity. This enables us to fulfil the requirement but does not create an obligation for those people to perform the lion's share of the work. From now on, fundraising events will only happen where there are sufficient volunteers to spread the effort.

Please let us know if you can help, if everyone does a little bit, we can continue to help run the amazing events and activities that have been done before.






Let's Celebrate!
