We also drew our May 100 Club winner in assembly today with our lucky winner of £51 being number 74- Mrs O'Mahony . Well done to you!



Let's Celebrate!


In **class 1** this week, we celebrated our love for Mary.







In **Class 3** this week, we have been imitating the work of Alberto Giacometti. We drew stick figures showing a variety of emotions, thinking about the shapes and angles of our limbs. We then create freezeframes by performing an action and pausing partway through. We drew these in our books as stick figures, again, thinking carefully about the angles and where knees and arms were bent. We then created some sculptures using crafting wire and tinfoil.







This week in geography, **Class 5** learned about trading including some of the most common and some unexpected imports and exports to and from the UK, like tartan kilts! They then played a trading game using shapes and Barkston bucks to gain an understanding of different resources countries may have, how they trade and how prices can increase and decrease depending on availability.
