



## Let's Celebrate!

In **class 1** the children have been learning about maps, they enjoyed drawing maps as a team.







In **Class 3** this week, we have been using our map and historical skills to identify the famous Roman road 'Watling Street' and the path that Boudicca led her rebellion on to their ultimate defeat at the Battle of Watling Street.

In **class 4** in maths, we used counters to explore how the digits move when we multiply and divide decimals by 10, 100 and 1000.

We enjoyed being able to write on the tables too!





This week in **Class 5**, continuing our work on forces, we explored the effects of several simple mechanisms: levers and pulleys. Using a see-saw style lever, we showed how the placement of the pivot made it much harder or much easier to lift Mr Craigen off the ground. After that, we explored the use of pulleys to lift buckets and weights.
