




Let's Celebrate!

We counted in multiples of five to the number before the big hand and then counted on in ones until we reach the big hand. This then became 'past' the hour. To work out how many minutes 'to', we repeated the process in reverse.

In **class 4** we enjoyed our art and DT days. In art, we all used merino wool to make our paintings using the 'wet felting' technique. We really enjoyed it when we had to make it very soapy!





In science this week, **Class 5** have been recapping and developing their understanding of circuits. After learning the symbols used in circuits, identifying errors in circuit diagrams and creating their own circuits, the children made buzzer games using the electrical components and copper wire.
