To apply for a school place you must complete the NYCC form online by 15th January 2023.



Let's Celebrate!


In **class 1** this week we have been learning about healthy food. Reception children made a food salad.







This week, in **class 3** we have begun to look at describing a familiar setting. We read 'The Lost Happy Endings' by Carol Ann Duffy. We closely looked at the description and descriptive features and discussed vocabulary we liked and worked out what these were examples of. We will have a go at writing our own description of the forest setting using our senses.







This week, in **class 5** in maths, we have been developing our understanding of area and perimeter using chair-space measures. By putting the chairs on the tables, we could see the area available for the chairs, and by counting around the outside where chairs could be placed, we could calculate the perimeter of the table. By arranging tables in different ways, we saw that a table with an area of 6 chair-spaces could have the same perimeter as a table with an area of 4 chair-spaces.
