




Let's Celebrate!

In **Class 1**, the children enjoyed exploring their sense of smell. We identified the smell of lavender, garlic, lemon juice, coffee and vinegar. We did a class pictogram of our favourite smell. Our favourite smell was coffee!

In **Class 2** this week, we have been identifying the parts of a plant. We matched each part to their name and talked about their functions





In **Class 3** this week, we have begun our work on the Roman history of York. We looked at the Roman Empire and then the roads and settlements in Britain before looking closely at the city of Eboracum.

In **Class 4** we have been working on materials and changing states in science this half term. This week we experimented with some chocolate to find out at what temperature it begins to melt. We used a fair test and discovered it is between 35 and 40 degrees centigrade.





In **Class 5**, as we are learning about changing states of matter, we investigated reversible and irreversible changes. For reversible changes, we considered the processes involved in the water cycle and made our own little water-cycle-in-a-bag experiments. We could see condensation forming! For irreversible changes, we created our own organic plastic using the irreversible chemical change that happens when we add vinegar to milk.
