Let's Celebrate!

In **Class 1**, children have been listening to the story of Handa's Surprise. They have been very busy with fruit activities!

In **Class 2**, we have been doing some fantastic maths work this week! Year 2 have been learning about multiplication and how to use arrays to help work them out. A lot of year 2 children chose to take some multiplication calculations home with them to continue their learning!! I am so proud of them for working so hard on such a tricky maths objective!





This week, in **Class 3**, we have started to look at letter writing. This is a lost skill, as we found out. We wrote informal letters and will begin to learn about persuasion next week.

In **Class 4** this week, we have been working on long multiplication in maths, very tricky indeed. We started with the 'grid method' and then moved onto the standard algorithm. So far we have multiplied 2 digit numbers by 2 digit numbers, next is three digit numbers!





In **Class 5**, we have been studying the miracle of the feeding of the five thousand. Firstly, we talked about metaphorical language and how this can impact on the listener by creating pictures with words. We then read several versions of the story and decided to create a playscript using a modern day reference. We thought carefully about the characters, setting and words chosen for our scripts. We then acted our scripts to check for accuracy, including stage directions and clarity of the key points of the story.
